

# How to make Betty's Flower Blossom Crown

## Materials & Equipment

Fresh flowers or artificial blossoms (a mix of large and small blooms works well)

Green floral wire

Floral Tape (Green is ideal)

Ribbon

Scissors or Wire Cutters



## Step One

### Measure the Base

Wrap the floral wire around your head (where the crown will sit) and cut it to size. Leave an extra inch or two to make a loop on each end of the ribbon. If using floral wire, double the wire.

## Step Two

### Secure the Base

Wrap floral tape around the twisted area to cover any sharp edges. Cutting the floral tape in 12" pieces simplify this step. Wrap slowly and press the floral tape to the stem.



## Step Three

### Prepare the Flowers

Trim flower stems to 2-3 inches. For delicate flowers, reinforce stems with floral wire if needed. For younger children have the flowers already cut.



## Step Four

### Attach the Flowers

Start with the largest flowers. Position one flower along the wire base and wrap its stem with floral tape to secure it.

Add greenery or filler flowers around the large blooms to fill gaps and create balance. Snip off extra pieces of stem not wanted on the crown.



## Step Five

### Attach the Flowers

Continue attaching flowers and greenery, slightly overlapping them to hide the floral tape. Alternate between large and small flowers for a natural look.



## Step Six

### Finish the Crown

Check for gaps or loose spots. Add extra flowers or greenery as needed. Secure the final piece with more floral tape if needed.



## Step Seven

### Adjust and Wear

Tie a piece of ribbon on each loop at both ends of the crown.

Gently bend the crown to adjust its shape, then place it on your head for a perfect fit.



Enjoy your handmade Flower Blossom Crown, just like the one's Betty's Mimi taught her to make with jacaranda blossoms.
